# Scholarship Opportunities in the Social Sciences

## ▲ Center for Engaged Scholarship Dissertation Fellowship

For Ph.D. students in the social sciences whose work can "contribute to making US society less unequal, more democratic, and more environmentally sustainable."

- Applicants should be Ph.D. students in the social sciences and humanities who have completed all coursework and exams but have not yet written and defended their dissertation
- Provides a \$25,000 stipend over 9 months in the fellowship year.

## ▲ Chateaubriand Fellowship

The Chateaubriand Fellowship supports Ph.D. students who wish to conduct part of their doctoral research in France.

- Research can range from 4-9 months

## ▲ F.J. McGuigan Dissertation Award

The F.J. McGuigan Dissertation Award supports dissertation research that addresses any aspect of mental function (e.g., cognition, affect, motivation) and seeks to understand the mind from both a behavioral and neural perspective.

- Award includes \$2,000 to support dissertation research
- Applicants must have completed doctoral candidacy, including dissertation approval by doctoral committee
